	Clerk reported that the application was still under consideration

(ii) 20/03382/FUL: Holly Farm, Selattyn, SY10 7HU. Proposal: Part conversion of single storey barn into ancillary accommodation. Council agreed unanimously to 'no comment' 1210 **Environmental matters:** (i) Hedge Maintenance (requested at July meeting) – to be chased up by locum Clerk Hengoed Cemetery -1211 Update – Cllr Michael McKenna explained that various site improvements including the renovation of the gates was in hand. He also explained that the ICCM issued helpful guidance to parish and other councils and held seminars and trainings sessions which were very valuable. Payments were now mainly done by BACS which was very helpful, and forms were being standardised. Cemetery Management arrangements – Cllr M McKenna proposed that the (ii) volume of work was such that a separate job role should be re-introduced, which he would be willing to do as a volunteer, if suitably trained at the Council's expense. It was agreed that the recruitment process for the Clerk was too far advanced for this to be altered but invited Cllr McKenna to work up a full proposal for consideration at a later date. Cllr McKenna proposed that the Council become members of the ICCM - to be considered at the October Council meeting. Cllrs Crow and McKenna were thanked for their work on the cemetery. 1212 Shropshire Housing Strategy and Local Plan – to consider and determine a response. Councillors noted the development areas and numbers of houses to be built in Gobowen (360 by 2028) and the proposals in the vicinity of Derwen College which impact on Selattyn and Gobowen Parish (240 houses, incl those for key workers). Councillors were concerned that proper steps be taken regarding the quality of houses and the development of suitable infrastructure, and that 'social housing' be integrated within a development. Cllr Macey confirmed this would be covered by the 'Shropshire Test'. Councillors wanted developments to be council led, not developer led. Councillors were keen to stress the importance of developments in broadband, sustainable rail and bus services, footpaths, cycle routes, and green corridors as well as drainage, flooding, and sewerage improvements. The need for suitable amenities should also not be overlooked. Councillors also expected that the Parish Council would be consulted directly on the Oswestry indicative master plan when it emerged. It was agreed that the proposed changes to national planning guidance would be considered at the October meeting 1213 **Future Agenda Items** Councillors are requested to use this opportunity to report minor matters of information

not included elsewhere on the agenda and to raise items for future agendas.
