Welcome

I hope you all had a safe & enjoyable Easter. It's nice to welcome Spring and hopefully some sunnier weather back again.

Firstly, I wanted to express our thanks to Three Parishes Big Local for a grant that the Parish Council has received. The £13,115 from Three Parishes Big Local will be used towards the cost of outdoor exercise equipment at Gobowen playing fields, so it is available for everyone to use.

Since our last publication the Clerk has been busy creating a new Parish Council website. This will bring the Council in line with latest guidance but also more importantly make the information far more user friendly. Don't forget to follow us on Facebook to keep up to date with news and information, you can find us by searching Selattyn and Gobowen PC.

In February Shropshire Council finally completed some long overdue improvements to the road surfaces in Gobowen, something the Parish Council has long been asking to be completed. There are still issues with road surfaces in other areas of the parish—if you become aware of an issue please report it directly to Shropshire Council on 0345 678 9000 or www.fixmystreet.com. We are now working to resolve some of the speeding and speed enforcement issues in the parish with Shropshire Councillors and Officers.

In March, myself and the Clerk attended a meeting with Sergeant Dulson and PC LeClere to discuss the rise in Anti-Social Behaviour in the community and ways we could work together to improve the situation. For any residents experiencing issues please contact the local neighbourhood policing team (contact details on page 22). West Mercia Police have also recently launched www.neighbourhoodmatters.co.uk to keep residents up to date with police work.

March also saw the Council consider a wide range of grants from local organisations and I am pleased to report that we distributed over £5,000 of support to the community. (More details on page 21)

In April construction work started on the new Garden of Remembrance area in Hengoed Cemetery, with the footings for ground works and a new path having now been excavated. The next phase is to lay the new gravel surface. We apologise for any inconvenience this may have caused however the works were necessary to ensure we maintain availability in future years.

Looking forward, I wanted to draw attention to the Jubilee celebrations in June. I know many residents will be planning on celebrating with their friends, family and neighbours locally. I also know of a few organised events within the Parish and I wanted to express my thanks to the volunteers who have spent lots of time and effort in making the events happen. See the back page for details of the event in Gobowen on Saturday 4th June.

Spring on the Old Racecourse Common 2022.

We have had our share of storms this spring, Dudley, Eunice, then Franklin which was the worst regarding tree damage. The Shropshire Countryside Team came up with their chainsaws and made the area safe and also removed a lot of the Birch saplings from among the Whinberry bushes by the carpark, this will encourage their growth and spread, the tiny flowers and later the berries are a valuable food source for wildlife.

In February, a group came up to do a survey on insects, the Wyre Volunteers are a specialist group of monitors doing important work on various sites. Among other things, they found a Juniper Shield Bug on the conifer in the corner of the old paddock, apparently quite rare. We hope to receive a copy of their report in the near future, it will be interesting to see what else they found.

There has been a good laying of frogspawn this year but the Byg pond is looking quite dry. It is quite overgrown with flag iris and rushes – so it is a project for the future.

There is a wide variety of birds on the

Racecourse common, the mistle thrush, garden warbler, bullfinch, tree creeper, brambling, lesser spotted woodpecker and goldcrest are all regulars here.

Bumblebees have started to emerge after a long winter tucked up in holes somewhere and sometimes a butterfly, when the sun shines in sheltered places. Wood anemones, celandine and wood sorrel flower here, and we are all looking forward to the bluebells in May, which lie in drifts under the trees all along the Racecourse.

The Oswestry Racecourse Management Association (made up of volunteers from residents, commoners, Shropshire Countryside Team and other interested groups) will start conducting their biannual site visits in April to check on the condition of the site and to schedule any jobs that can be done by the group or the Shropshire Countryside Team this year.

Visitors up to the Racecourse will have spotted a new bench at the top of the North Common. This is a popular area to sit and take in the view over to the welsh hills but there had previously been only one bench. There have been several requests in the past to site benches in memoriam which had been refused but a new policy will allow one or two more benches to be sited around the common in pre selected areas which will overlook other views of the surrounding countryside. There is already a waiting list at this time.

Night frosts and the odd snow shower up

here have delayed leaf growth and blossom slightly, we are usually about three weeks behind Oswestry up here, but we are into spring now, but beware.

On Back Racecourse Lane there are some potholes, circled with white paint, (smaller holes left to mature before qualifying for repair), and there are some whoppers on the tarmac edge of the lane heading from the car park to the cross roads, so if you come that way, please use the track entrances to pull over to allow cars to pass, rather than try to pass each other on the lane. Your springs and axles will thank you!



Fairfield Close

At the Parish Council meeting on 13th April, Councillors and members of the public heard a presentation from STAR Housing about the future of Fairfield Close. Members of the public had an opportunity to voice their concerns.

The Parish Council have committed to keeping the community informed and will negotiate with STAR Housing for a public meeting later in the year.

The following is an update received from STAR Housing for publishing in this magazine.

Update from STAR Housing

Ayyaz Ahmed, Head of Neighbourhoods at STAR Housing attended the Parish Council meeting on Wednesday 13 April 2022. This was an opportunity to listen to residents about the potential redevelopment of Fairfield Close. Ayyaz on behalf of STAR Housing, wanted to thank all the people who attended the meeting for taking the time to express their thoughts.

What is going to happen to the residents?

The current residents of Fairfield Close are being supported individually to help them consider what they would need if Fairfield Close is redeveloped and any move required. STAR Housing have a full time Community Support Officer now working on the Project and they will make sure that each individual resident is able to achieve their needs. and preferences for a new home, be it the new build scheme at Weston Rhyn, STAR Housing's other sites or with other landlords. STAR is also working closely with everyone to make sure that residents will have all the help they need logistically for any move required. What is going to happen to Fairfield

What is going to happen to Fairfield Close once it's empty? Are you just going to put a massive block of flats up?

There are no firm plans for Fairfield Close at the moment. A comprehensive feasibility study is to be completed, which will help inform future plans. This will take several months to complete.

STAR expects to submit a formal planning application by the end of this year, following consultation and continuous engagement with the Parish Council, the Community and other local partner agencies.

Why are you knocking Fairfield Close down? Why can't you redevelop it like other places?

STAR understands from community feedback that Fairfield Close is valued

as a supportive community. Balancing the needs of the community with an increased demand for quality housing that meets modern needs is at the forefront of our development plans.

Unfortunately, the estate is simply no longer suitable for modern living; properties are small and don't meet expected space standards. There have been issues with the popularity of the scheme when vacancies have arisen in the past. Upgrading Fairfield Close is not a viable option as the existing properties cannot meet these demands for space and thermal efficiency.

New homes with more modern designs and technologies will help maximise energy efficiency whilst making sure that the scheme meets expectations of the future population of Gobowen.

STAR Housing

Shropshire Council Library Strategy Report

At a Shropshire Council meeting on March 23rd 2022 the Council agreed a strategy for its libraries.

The Council's aim of this strategy is to broaden the scope of the services on offer within the library service. It is hoped to be encouraging a more diverse age range of people to use the service.

They had previously held a survey amongst library users.

The survey showed that people valued the library service and felt it was an important asset to their community

Most of the 900 responses came from females aged over 60. Very few from people under 30 years of age.

The Council's view is that a library should become a community hub the 'go to' place where users would have access to other services or information on where services could be available.

Council will be asking staff to change their way of working.

To achieve this, the council will be fitting self-service machines into libraries where suitable. Self service machines are not to replace staff but will allow them to develop other skills. Staff will be freed up to develop and enhance other services.

Opening hours of certain libraries could be changed to include opening later, whatever suits the local community that they serve.

Some libraries will share accommodation with other services.

Shropshire Council stressed that this was not a cost cutting exercise but their budget has been reduced.

Some rural areas may lose their library service and some mobile libraries will be redirecting their service.

The next stage of this strategy is to go out to public consultation. The public consultation will be tailored to individual libraries to cater for their individual needs

It is very important that we continue to

be aware of possible problems for our library service in Gobowen. A lot of the possible changes that Shropshire Council wish to implement would not be suitable or possible in Gobowen library.



- Keep dogs on a lead. This is clearly signposted at the entrances to the playing fields
- Keep dogs away from the children's play area and out of the sports court.
- Keep dogs off the football pitch wherever possible
- <u>ALWAYS</u> clean up after your dog and place all dog poo bags in the bins positioned at each entrance.

Parish Council Grants

The Parish Council considers grant applications from local organisations, community groups and charities at the March meeting each year. This year saw the first grants being awarded from the new Roundabout Community Fund, set up to invest the surplus funds that remained when the Community Meals service came to a natural end. The following grants were awarded from this new fund:

£1000 to the foodbank operating from Preeshenlle United Reformed Church, £1000 to Signal UK for an exciting new

project to support the deaf and hard of hearing community in the parish, and £352 for new equipment for the youth café managed by The New Saints FC Community Foundation.

Grants from the regular Parish Council Grants fund were awarded to Parkinson's in the Marches, Selattyn Produce and Craft Show, Friends of Gobowen School, The New Saints FC Community Foundation and Crane Quality Counselling.

Selattyn Burial Ground, All Saints Church, Gobowen and St Mary's Church, Selattyn each received £250 towards the costs of cemetery grounds maintenance.

The total value of grants awarded was over £5,000. The purpose and value of each grant is published in the minutes of the March meeting, available on the Parish Council website www.selattyngobowenpc.org.uk.

Oil Thefts -Crime Prevention Advice

Following a recent spike in crude oil prices the cost of heating oil has also increased, leading to an increase in theft offences involving heating oil.

Reports have been received relating to thefts from tanks at properties and commercial premises in rural locations.

The risk of oil theft can be reduced by taking some or all of the following measures.

Implement a fuel management system with key or code access and alarm features

Ensure the tank is overlooked with natural and physical surveillance such as lighting and CCTV

Reduce access points by locking gates and blocking unused access

Install anti-siphoning devices and locking fuel caps

Restrict access to the site where the tank is kept by locking gates, installing fencing and bollards

Also consider general security around your farm yard, home or construction site. Those involved in fuel theft won't think twice about stealing machinery, tools and quad bikes too

Ensure items of value are stored securely and out of view

Use motion sensor lighting and alarms in sensitive areas

Improve natural surveillance, increasing the view of sensitive areas

Consider investing in remote monitoring systems and CCTV

Use clamps or locks on quads and off

road bikes when not in use Consider installing immobilisers, tracker systems and forensic vehicle marking products



Homemade compost is a fantastic resource for our gardens. It can be used as a soil improver, a mulch, or to make a potting mix.

It improves soil structure, improving drainage in clay soils and aiding moisture retention in sandy soils. It provides valuable nutrients to our garden plants in a readily available form, encouraging healthy growth and pest/disease resistance. As an organic addition to our gardens it increases biological activity in the soil, vital to a healthy garden.

Composting at home can help reduce our financial outlay on shop bought compost and fertilisers.

In addition to these benefits home composting is also environmentally sustainable. Roughly 40% of our household waste sent to landfill can actually be composted. We still send huge amounts of biodegradable waste to landfill, so by composting at home we can do our bit for the planet by taking responsibility for some of the waste we produce. A bokashi bin can enable us to compost food waste safely, reducing still further what we individually send to landfill. Home compost is the ultimate in recycling!

Best of all home composting is free and good for our wellbeing

Countryside Issues—Advice from NFU

As a largely rural parish, we are fortunate in being able to easily access countryside footpaths and bridleways to enjoy beautiful views, fresh air and exercise.

Many of us also take along our family dogs when out and about. For many, the countryside is a place of work and they rely on it for their livelihood. When walking, it is important that we respect the countryside and follow the Countryside Code.

Hundreds of sheep and cattle die as a result of injuries caused by dogs every year and these incidents cause distress for farmers and their livestock.

People find it hard to believe that their pet can be a danger to livestock but whatever their temperament, dogs have a chase instinct that can be triggered by the sight or movement of farm animals.

The great animal loving people of Selattyn and Gobowen parish would be horrified to see what damage an uncontrolled dog can do.

Other indirect injuries can occur as a consequence of animals stumbling and suffering from broken limbs or lacerations as they try to escape through fencing, hedges or wire to get away from the animal that is chasing them; dogs can

also cause serious distress to pregnant livestock causing them to abort.

We love people visiting the countryside, sticking to the Countryside Code of course, and it's great for people's mental health and wellbeing.

We saw the number of visitors swell during Covid lockdown, which was great but as well as a fabulous place to visit the countryside is a working landscape where we are busy producing high quality food.

We are acutely aware that when dogs are off the lead around livestock it can have disastrous effects.

The National Farmers' Union (NFU) has worked with the Kennel Club and others on advice for pet owners and we would urge dog walkers to keep their animals under close, effective control and on a short lead when they are near livestock.

We were on farm recently with Graeme Hall, also known as The Dogfather, who is a master dogtrainer and host of Channel 5's *Dogs Behaving*(Very) *Badly and he* helped put together a national sheep worrying video available online – this helps educate


the public about handling their pets around livestock.
