Your Parish - Some facts!

There's much more to Selattyn and Gobowen Parish than you may realise. With an area of just over 12 square miles, it's one of the largest parishes in Shropshire. Sharing a boundary with Wales in the west and with the Llangollen canal running along the parish's northeastern border, places of interest to visit within the parish include Selattyn Tower, Old Oswestry Hillfort and the north common of Oswestry Racecourse. The Parish has approximately 31 miles of footpaths including parts of Offa's Dyke Path, Wat's Dyke Way, and St Oswald's Trail!

Did you know that Derwen College and The Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital are in the parish? Nowadays they are key employers and service providers to local people but they are a significant part of the history of this parish. Read a brief history of Derwen College and the services that they now offer to this community on page 20. The Annual Meeting of the Parish took place on 24th May. I would like to thank all the local residents and community groups that attended and contributed to the meeting. Community spirit has been in abundance across our parish over the last few months—Coronation events, Selattyn Fete and Gobowen Family Fun Day to name just a few. These events wouldn't happen without the hours of organising and support by dedicated volunteers and I'm sure that everyone in our community will join me in thanking them for their efforts. By the time this edition is distributed, the Parish Council should have completed the scheduled memorial safety inspections at Hengoed Cemetery. These inspections are an essential part of managing a cemetery for the safety of all visitors. Any memorials found to be unsafe will have had temporary supports installed and a sign put up asking the family to contact us. Whilst we make every effort to contact families ourselves we often find that we don't have up to date contact information. If you are the registered owner of a grave at the cemetery, please don't forget to keep us informed if you move house or change your email address or telephone number.

Visitors to Gobowen Playing Fields in recent weeks may have noticed that the engineering works to the banks of the River Perry have happened. In places, the bank has been changed from a steep drop to a gradual incline to reduce the risk of bank erosion when the river levels are high. The soil along the banks, and near the hedge has been planted with a grass seed and wildflower mix and we are now working on a plan to manage the river bank to support nature and biodiversity. We are looking forward to seeing the results next summer!

S&G Local History Group Local Places of Worship

We are aware of six places of Worship in the Parish, of which three remain as Churches. The oldest by far is the Church of St. Mary, Selattyn which celebrated 700 years since its known foundation in 1291, in 1991. Betty Shaw prepared an excellent booklet at the time, describing the church and its history. A copy of this is held for reference in Gobowen Library.

Preeshenlle Church also has a long, if more recent history and will be looked at in a separate article, together with the Church at Rhewl and the former Methodist Chapel by the Gobowen roundabout, both of which have been converted to dwellings.

St Barnabas Church at Hengoed was closed in 1981 and subsequently and controversially demolished later that decade. We have few facts and no photos of the Church. There is only a stone which marks its location in Hengoed Cemetery. We would welcome any information on St. Barnabas and the other closed church and chapel.

All Saints Church is the most recent, reflecting the growing population of Gobowen. The foundation stone was laid by the Earl of Powis in 1926 and the completed church was consecrated by the Bishop of Lichfield in June 1928. It suffered a devastating arson attack in 1979. This resulted in only the four main walls left standing together with the Church Tower and the Choir Vestry.

These also suffered water damage. The fire brigade had to focus on successfully saving the Church Hall which was quickly dedicated as a temporary place of worship, just in time for a planned wedding.

Major fundraising events took place which, with insurance money, enabled a rapid rebuilding of the Church which was re-consecrated in October 1981. New fittings included items from closed churches elsewhere. A new east window was commissioned from Laurence Lee, a famous stained glass



designer who was also responsible for windows in Coventry, Gloucester and Guildford Cathedrals.

A war memorial for Hengoed took the form of a Processional Cross which came from St Barnabas Church and which is now held at All Saints and is a feature of Sunday Services. There are, of course, the permanent war memorials at St. Mary's Church and in Gobowen Village.

Details of those from the Parish who lost their lives in the two World Wars are provided by a booklet called 'Our Fallen' that was widely distributed a few years ago, and copies of which are held by the library.



Community Speed Watch

members.ourwatchmember.org.uk/join and fill in your details and follow the process through to the end. Once you have done that and you are in your account, select the 'Manage Schemes' option in the 'dropdown' under

'Neighbourhood Watch Tools' in the top banner on the page, then click on the yellow 'JOIN OR APPLY TO CREATE A NEW SCHEME bar and follow the process through to the end, selecting Gobowen, to join this scheme. If you don't have access we can also manually sign you up, please get in touch for more details.

Once you register you can then also officially confirm to your home insurance company, that you are a member of Neighbourhood Watch and are in a Watch Scheme. Most companies will give a further discount on your policy for being a member. You will need your membership Number from your NW Account.

We've planned our first meeting on Saturday 9th September at 10am in Gobowen Pavilion. Please feel free to come along and meet others. Going forward I'll look to invite guests to give advice & top tips around crime prevention.

Finally, as part of the Neighbourhood Watch we will be completing a litter pick within Gobowen on the last Saturday of each month. The first session will take place on Saturday 30th September between 10-12, meeting at Gobowen Pavilion. We'll have litter pickers and bags available but would suggest you bring some gloves.



Bryn Y Castell Coppice Conservation Group

As we all experience the dramatic effects of climate change, Nature meanwhile carries on 'doing its thing' in our small wetland wood at the rear of Gobowen Playing Fields.

This year, the Coppice is particularly green, overgrown and, in some places, wet and impenetrable. So, bird, insect and plant life thrives relatively undisturbed. However, it is also apparent that we are now seeing fewer insects: butterflies, moths and dragonflies. Many types of birds are still abundant, the common species plus owls, warblers and rarely the lesser spotted woodpecker. The situation does not quite reflect the visible change in our



own gardens, where the bigger birds such as Jackdaws, Crows and pigeons, are tending more to dominate smaller species.

The role of the small Coppice Group remains to encourage all forms of plant and animal life, in an environment where visitors can safely access and enjoy seasonal changes. Our conservation work includes tidying, clearing undergrowth and trimming. We sometimes find discarded bicycle and scooter wreckage and even building materials.

Installing nesting boxes is a constant priority because of losses due to vandalism and theft. Tree management requires occasional roping-off, for safety, and felling especially the predominant crack willow. Through our efforts, we reinforce aspects of biodiversity at a local level, helping a large variety of often unseen species to survive.

Gobowen Foodbank

Well here we are on 2023 and still very much in demand.

When we started, when lock down was upon us, we literally started with nothing, except putting posters out around the village for help with contributions of food.

We sat outside our premises waiting for some response, and then came the task of writing numerous letters asking for financial help. We eventually started having grants and were able to buy food in and recruit volunteers.

It has been a huge benefit to the community, but we are at the moment struggling to keep going and we are not sure how much longer we can keep operating. We do appreciate times are hard for everyone, but if you can donate food items or any financial support we would be extremely grateful, as we are spending between £250/£300 every week on food.

PC Katie Le'Clere, PCSO Dave Hughes and PCSO Pete Roberts are West Mercia Police's Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) covering this area.

Contacting your local officers directly is a good way to provide information and to be made aware of local issues. However West Mercia Police say that this is not a suitable way for reporting crimes/incidents that require a crime number and or police attendance.

Should you need to make a report please follow the guidance below.

Emergency 999

Does it feel like the situation could get heated or violent very soon?
Is someone in immediate danger? Do you need support right away?
If so, please call 999 now.
If you accidentally dial 999, please stay

on the line and tell the operator you're safe and that no crime has occurred.

Hearing or speech impairments

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use our textphone service 18000 or text us on 999 if you've preregistered with the emergency SMS service.

If you're a British Sign Language (BSL) user, you can call 999 BSL to use a remote BSL interpreter.

Silent 999 calls

If you're in danger but you can't talk on the phone, you should still call 999, then follow any instructions that you are given by the operator if you can.

Non-emergency 101

Call 101 for non-emergency enquiries.

Parking

We have received messages of concern over parking within the parish recently, although the vast majority are parking with consideration and courtesy to others. The reports include parking at junctions and double parking, obstruction of the road.

Whilst many parking offences were decriminalised in November 2014, the Traffic Management Act 2004 allows a Penalty Charge Notice to be posted to the registered keeper of the vehicle although the majority are pasted on the windscreen. Most parking offences are dealt with by Shropshire Council and these can be reported directly to them.

Police can enforce certain parking issues such as:

Vehicles parked on pavements - this is a police matter: please report the matter to the police on tel: 101 or report on the West Mercia website

Vehicles obstructing driveways - this is a police matter: please report the matter to the police on tel: 101 or report on the West Mercia website

Vehicles that are parked so as to obstruct visibility - this is a police matter: please report the matter to the police on tel: 101 or report on the West Mercia website

In these instances there would need to be a full obstruction of the pavement, driveway or visibility. In the first instance advice can be given, most drivers do not intend to block or obstruct and advice or a reminder can be all that is required. If the problem becomes more persistent than further action can be taken.

The local Safer Neighbourhood Team can be called for further advice on such issues.





This report from Councillor Craig Emery was given to the Annual Parish Meeting on 24th May. The meeting also received reports from organisations across the parish copies of all the reports are available to read on the Parish Council website.

"As Chairman of the Parish Council for the last 2 years I just wanted to welcome you the Annual Parish Meeting this evening and thank you for coming to join us here tonight. Please accept my apologies for not being able to join you this evening but I know Erica and the rest of the Councillors will do a great job in my absence.

It would also be remiss of me not to mention that we meet at least once a month and its always nice to see and hear from residents to ensure we implement things that you would like to see. For those of you who may be interested in getting involved a little more, we also have 2 Councillor vacancies, tonight is a great chance to speak to Councillors to understand what the role entails if you are interested.

Over the last 12 months we've continued to invest funds to make several improvements to facilities within the Parish:

- The 'Elizabeth Garden' new garden of remembrance area
- Continued LED upgrade and concrete column replacement
- Improved CCTV coverage of Pavilion and playing field
- New main door and improved external lighting at the Pavilion
- Relocated defibrillator for better coverage across the village.

We've also looked to enhance the Parish with new projects which look to provide an immediate benefit such as:

- 4 new litter bins
- Funding for Jubilee and coronation events and Xmas trees.

We've also continued to look forward and we have several future projects in development such as:

- Bus Shelter
- River Perry bank engineering works
- New noticeboard at Hengoed Cemetery
- Pavilion refurbishment & redecoration works

Council. In Gobowen the return of large scale events such as the Bonfire Night has really helped to bring the community together, thanks to the volunteers at Gobowen Community Group for the hard work they do. We've also supported locally by:

- Awarding 16 grants totalling over £6500 at March 2023 meeting
- Books of condolence following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II
- Sharing information from local agencies through website and facebook page.
- Feeding into Shropshire Council consultations e.g. Local Cycling & Walking Infrastructure Programme.
- Providing community feedback into other agencies e.g. Airband, Star Housing, Shropshire Highways.

Councillors have continued to 'get things done' in the community, so thank you go to the councillors who dedicate their free time to support our Parish. Without them, the Parish just wouldn't be the same, things like:

Our Parish - Derwen College

It's been on our doorstep for years, but I wonder how many of you know what goes on behind the trees and hedges surrounding the Derwen College campus in Gobowen?

Derwen College was established many years ago by Dame Agnes Hunt who, following the success of her convalescent home and, later, the RJAH Orthopaedic Hospital, was persuaded by Sir Robert Jones to open a training college for people with disabilities.

The Georgian farmhouse, The Derwen, was purchased and Derwen College created. Here, physically disabled students would learn such skills and trades as boot-making, leatherwork, and dress-making so they could find ways to become independent and earn a living.

Move forwards nearly 100 years and Derwen College students now learn skills in horticulture, hospitality and food, retail and enterprise and performing arts with hopes and aspirations for the same outcome – to become as independent as possible in their future lives.

The original Derwen farmhouse is now The Orangery and home to a training restaurant for students on the Hospitality and Food pathway. Through working in The Orangery, which is open to the public for lunchtime meals, our students learn skills in food preparation, cooking, customer service, laying up and waiting on tables, plus embedded skills in English and maths with menu writing and bill preparation plus a whole lot more.

Other outlets at Derwen Marketplace include; The Vintage Advantage, which is our award-winning charity shop — always good for a browse! The Walled Garden Café, which has a play area for children and a selection of delicious Derwen-made cakes; and The Garden Centre and Gift Shop, which has a great selection of seasonal plants and artisan gifts.

These are all open to the public seven days a week and through these outlets our students gain valuable real-life work experience that they are able to take with them and use once they leave college.

If you ever catch a train from Gobowen Station, Derwen College, in partnership with Severn Dee Travel, offers refreshments to commuters and visitors through the Station Café.

Also, Derwen College has its very own training hotel which was established in partnership with Premier Inn. Hotel 751, as it's called, is located within the College campus and is also available for members of the public to book and stay in. It is

another fabulous opportunity for our students to learn valuable skills and gain experience.

Once our students have completed their internal work experience programme within Derwen Marketplace, we find external work experience opportunities for them to continue building on their skills. They attend many local businesses, supported by their job coach, learning extra skills in new environments and with valuable travel training skills along the way.

We have many heart-warming stories of our students achieving success once they finish their programmes at Derwen College. Our students are aspirational and inspirational, and there are many proud moments as we watch them develop, gain confidence and achieve success.

Christmas Lights

Over the past few months, the Parish Council has been investigating the possibility of purchasing Christmas lights to install on the street lights in Gobowen village centre.

The total cost to purchase, install and operate 10 lights is £8,565 for the first year, and £4190 for every future year until the Christmas lights need replacing.

The Parish Council decided not to go ahead with the project as the costs were considered too high.

Although the Council has reserves to cover the costs of the first year, the £4190 for every future year would have to be covered by increasing the Precept

by at least 4.5%. The Precept is the part of your Council Tax that is used to fund the services provided by the Parish Council.

The Council is now looking at other options and is asking for ideas from residents. If you have any ideas about ways to make the parish look more festive please get in touch. Our contact details are on page 2 of this magazine.
