#### Welcome

Happy New Year & Welcome to the first Roundabout of 2023. I hope you all had a safe & enjoyable Christmas.

For many of us, the cost of living crisis has had an impact and it can be difficult to know where to turn for advice and support. Shropshire Council has produced a leaflet listing details of sources of help and has given permission for the leaflet to be re-printed in this magazine. Please see the **centre pages** for a copy to pull out and keep.

In late 2022 the Parish Council relocated our defibrillator from outside Gobowen Post Office to the Pavilion. This was due to Transport for Wales providing another defibrillator at the train station. The council felt it prudent to move ours, providing greater coverage across Gobowen.

In response to a request from a resident, we have funded a Bleed Kit for Selattyn. We'll monitor how this goes and may look to roll these out to the rest of the Parish.

Last month the Parish Council agreed the budget for 2023/24. The Council agreed to a 2% increase to the Council Tax Precept which equates to an annual increase of £1.31 for a Band D property. Whilst continuing to fund our existing responsibilities, including the production of this Parish Roundabout newsletter, the Council has also committed:

- £700 to purchase two additional bins (Shropshire Council responsibility)
- £19101 to continue the replacement of concrete streetlight columns
- £11000 to complete erosion prevention works on River Perry to ensure the playing fields remain safe
- £1000 to fund the development of a Youth Work Programme

Councillor Mandy Lloyd stepped down from the Parish Council in January. On behalf of the Council, I would like to thank Mandy for her service to our community during her time as Councillor. The Parish Council will be co-opting to fill this vacancy — keep an eye on local noticeboards and our facebook page for the deadline for applications, or contact the Parish Clerk for more information.

Finally, we're looking for a volunteer to help produce the quarterly Parish Roundabout magazine. A summary of the role is shown at the top of **page 4.** Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to find out more.

#### **Poppy Appeal Volunteers needed**

POPPY APPEAL ORGANISING ROLE—Each year thousands of wonderful volunteers descend on high streets, train stations and local supermarkets across the country to help raise vital funds during the Poppy Appeal. This role involves the organisation, planning, and delivery of the Poppy Appeal within Oswestry, Gobowen, Whittington, Kinnerley and Nescliffe. This role is suited to people who are passionate about our Armed Forces, keen to help their community take part in Remembrance and have organisational skills to put to good use.

POPPY BOX DELIVERIES ORGANISER – this involves ordering the stock and prepping to make ready, contacting

schools,

businesses etc to organise delivery of poppies and

collecting tins, arranging the volunteers who take out the boxes of poppies and collecting tins across the district, supplying the volunteers with paperwork for each round of deliveries, topping up stores who run out of stock, and arranging for the volunteers to bring everything back in after the appeal. Once the funds are counted you then supply the volunteers with the totals to inform the local community.

All training is provided, plus the local community fundraiser is on hand to walk you through the whole process. Local volunteers who do the deliveries are in place, this is an organisational role to support the volunteers. Local knowledge, references and access to a vehicle are required. #### Parish Paths Partnership (P3)

Notwithstanding seriously inclement weather during recent weeks, the P3 Group has been out repairing public footpath installations across the Parish. Work has included replacing stile steps near Offa's Dyke in Selattyn, rebuilding a bridge step, erecting a finger post and helping out with much needed vegetation clearance at Oswestry Racecourse (North) and by the 'Black Bridge' in Gobowen.

Clearly, footpaths have been more used during and since Covid. That has resulted in much wear and tear particularly on timber stiles, some of which are many years old. Walkers are asked as always to report any 'problem' stiles on the Shropshire Council website. The P3 Group will then be asked, where appropriate, to rectify matters and, in some cases, to install galvanised kissing gates.

Finally, a word about cattle. There are frequent newspaper reports of walkers, especially when accompanied by dogs, becoming the focus of unwanted attention, which sadly sometimes leads to injury. Whereas the P3 group has the advantage of numbers, and usually an escape route, there is always a risk

around cows with their calves and from a solitary animal. Farm animals are unpredictable, so please while enjoying our many Public Rights of Way, stay aware, keep your eyes open and be prepared to adjust your route on the day!

#### **Parish Defibrillators**

In November, the defibrillator that was located at the Post Office was moved to the Pavilion at the Playing Fields. The Parish Council took this decision as Transport for Wales has installed a defibrillator next to the level crossing, less than 100m away from the Post Office. Moving the Parish Council defibrillator to the Pavilion has provided better coverage across the village.

If you are aware of any other Public Access Defibrillators in the parish that can be added to the list, please get in touch.

#### What to do in an Emergency

The British Heart Foundation advice if you are dealing with a patient that is unconscious / not breathing is to:

- 1. Dial 999
- 2. Start CPR

When you dial 999, the ambulance

service will direct you to the nearest available defibrillator that is in service.

On rare occasions defibrillators can be out of service (for example if they have already been collected for another emergency or if they have been removed for maintenance). The Ambulance service's records should always be up to date so they can direct you to the nearest defibrillator.

#### Bleed control kit.

The Parish Council has recently purchased and installed a Bleed Control Kit alongside the defibrillator in the telephone kiosk on Glyn Road in Selattyn. Bleed control kits can be used by members of the public if someone suffers a catastrophic bleed. They contain equipment to provide first aid to reduce blood loss until professional medical help arrives.



#### Benefit Advance

If you have made a new claim for benefit and are in financial hardship while you wait for your first payment, you may be able to get an advance to afford things like rent or food. It's important to get advice before taking out an advance. Benefit advances must be paid back, and the money will be taken from your future benefit payments (a loan).

#### **Hardship Payment**

If you have been sanctioned, you may be able to request a hardship payment from the DWP. Hardship payments are not always paid immediately, and they're not available to everyone. Hardship payments of Universal Credit need to be paid back (a loan), but hardship payments of JobSeekers Allowance or Employment Support Allowance do not (not a loan).

#### 6) Challenge a Decision

You can challenge a benefit decision if your benefit has been stopped / sanctioned / reduced / refused or you have been overpaid. Most benefit decisions need to be challenged within one month.

## Shropshire Fire & Rescue Service: Safe and well visits

Hi there. My name is Archie Walkerdine and I work for Shropshire Fire & Rescue Service as a Fire Prevention Officer. I am part of a small team



based at Headquarters in Shrewsbury with my area of responsibility being the West of Shropshire.

My role as a Prevention Officer is wide and varied, however the majority of my workload, is organising and undertaking what are known as Safe and Well visits. This is a free home fire safety visit, tailored to an individual's needs, that support members of our community to help protect them and their home from fire.

The purpose of the visit is to ensure that you are aware of potential hazards within the home and can take appropriate actions. The visit is not to judge your lifestyle, but to keep you safe from fire.

#### What we will do:

- Arrange a convenient time to visit
- Talk about the main causes of fire in the home
- Test smoke alarms
- Discuss points to consider when making a home fire escape plan
- Give advice on the action to be taken in the event of a fire

There are several lifestyle questions that we will ask and, dependent on your answers and if we have your consent, we can refer you to agencies that can give you further advice and support. For example:

- How often do you get out for social engagements?
- How often do you receive social visitors/ friends / family?
- Would you like someone to contact you to assess and give advice on a range of services that could help you.

#### 'Spotlight' on Gobowen Station

Gobowen Station was purchased by Oswestry Station Building Trust (OSBT) in 2017 to keep the buildings as a community asset. Since then, work has been ongoing to refurbish the buildings. OSBT Trustee, Henry Thomas, explains future plans:

The main building at Gobowen Station is in dire need of external repairs, and it is hoped to carry out work on it next summer. An application has been made to the Government's "Community Ownership Fund" for a grant towards the substantial costs, and Oswestry Station Building Trust (owner of the buildings) is waiting to hear whether this bid has been successful; we are most grateful to local organisations and individuals who have provided letters of support to back up the application. Three Parishes Big Lottery has already contributed to the project, and a grant from the Railway Heritage Trust has been agreed in principle.

Cement render was applied to the building during the 1980's conversion to commercial units, but chunks of it are now falling off, and it is also trapping moisture within the walls. The most important part of our project is therefore to remove the cement and replace it with breathable lime rendering which is compatible with the original 1848 construction, including replication of the moulded details. We will also repair roofs, chimneys, gutters, windows, etc., and all this requires scaffolding erected under Network Rail supervision while no trains are running. In addition external repairs will be carried out on the single-storey booking office building, to follow on from the recent internal renovation and the new period-style refreshment counter.



We are excited at the prospect of restoring the village's most prominent building to a condition we can be proud of, and enhancing the station and its surroundings for residents and visitors alike. Gobowen station is Grade II Listed and is highly regarded by architectural historians; typical quotes are "A fine essay in an Italianate villa style, contrasting strongly with the architect's

Tudor cottage designs for this line" and "The Shrewsbury & Chester Railway built a remarkable variety of small stations: half-timbered at Leaton and Whittington; Tudor at Chirk, Rossett and Ruabon; cottage ornee at Baschurch with gables and turret; and strangest of all this perfect little essay in Florentine at Gobowen...... the place has great charm and illustrates the wide diversity of English station building in the first decades of the railways."

The grants will help us to safeguard the work of Severn Dee Travel, the not-for-profit agency which provides much-appreciated ticket sales and advice, as well as a welcoming waiting room and the popular cafe run by Derwen College students. We also hope it will encourage more people to use the train service and reduce their CO2 emissions.

I would also add that we shortly expect to be seeking a new tenant for one of the units in the main building, which is suitable for retail or office use and has direct access from the platform. Any enquiries would be welcomed.

#### **NEW: Government Emergency Alerts system live soon**

The UK government's new Emergency Alerts system will be live early this year. The system will enable people to be contacted via their mobile phone when lives are in danger.

It will be used to warn you in the event of emergencies, such as severe flooding. Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They don't track your location, need your phone number or collect personal data.

Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you don't have a mobile phone, you'll still be kept informed through other channels.

If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you'll hear a loud, siren-like sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the emergency and how best to respond. To find out more about Emergency Alerts, visit www.gov.uk/alerts.

#### Voter ID required in polling stations from May 2023

From 4 May 2023 voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections, including local elections, parliamentary by-elections and Police and Crime Commissioner elections.

A full list of accepted forms of photo ID is shown on the Electoral commission's website and includes a UK Passport, driving licence, blue badge, bus pass. Visit www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/voter/voter-id for full details and what to do if you don't have any of the photo id documents that they list.
