Welcome

It's been a time of incredible change nationally since our last edition. During the Summer, many of us came together to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee – joining together to meet friends and loved ones who we have missed through Covid. It was great to see so many people enjoy themselves and we managed to miss most of the bad British weather.

We then received the unfortunate news of the passing of our late monarch, Queen Elizabeth II, a person who dedicated her life to public service. In such a turbulent world she often provided stability and we give our thanks for all that she did for the country.

As a lasting memorial the Parish Council are currently engaged in conversations with a neighbouring Parish Council around a tree planting project between the villages.

Our Parish has so many things to be proud about. My congratulations go to Derwen College for winning the Queen's Award for Enterprise for Promoting Opportunity 2022. It was a pleasure to celebrate with you and I am so pleased that your hard work has been recognised at the highest level.

The Parish Council also continues to look at ways of improving our local environment and following recent feedback has purchased and installed bins on Disley Close / Chirk Road junction & at the entrance to Forster's Meadow on Preeshenlle Lane. One other suggested site was near Belmont Bridge however this was turned down as Shropshire Council felt it may lead to an increased risk of fly tipping. We will continue to look at other locations across the parish based on demand so please let the Clerk know your suggested locations.

So far this year, donations have been made to support a number of local events including £335 towards Selattyn Jubilee celebrations, £100 towards Selattyn Produce & Craft Show, £150 towards Gobowen Christmas Tree and £500 towards Community Firework & Bonfire event. A big thank you goes to each and every volunteer who works hard to contribute to these community events.

Road safety issues continue to be reported to the Parish Council, over the summer I've been continuing work with West Mercia Police around setting up a Community Speedwatch (see page 4 for more details) to help address these issues within the whole Parish.

In October Shropshire Council announced their intention to include Gobowen School within their 'School Streets' trial. We've raised road safety concerns many times with our Shropshire Councillors during meetings especially around the need to introduce 20mph zones around our schools to protect those travelling to school so it's really pleasing that a solution has finally been proposed.

Goodbye from Big Local

The end of 2022 marks the end of Three Parishes Big Local. In its preliminary stage the vision set out was that "In 10 years time, the Three Parishes Big Local Programme will have improved the lives of the people who live in and around the area. The Three Parishes will be even more safe and comfortable and will be good places to live, learn and grow."

In this time we have seen a lot of changes and growth in our villages.

Our final Messenger will be coming through your door soon with lots more stories about what we have done, but here are a few highlights and overviews

Grants—Over £400,000 has been awarded in grants!! This funding has helped to maintain, improve and enhance facilities in our villages. It has supported groups and organisations, and created new opportunities .

Health & Wellbeing—A series of helpful health & well being sessions have been delivered across the Three Parishes by Community Resource. There has also been an Eat Well for Less project delivered through the primary schools

with helpful tips included in our final messenger

My Money Matters—Karen Williams has helped residents of 3PBL claim / save over £1million over the course of the project. Her care, commitment and support has been a huge benefit to many and will continue to be so as residents receive the support they are entitled to, but had previously been unaware of, or unable to apply for

Business Support—Paul Newman of Beabetterfish has supported lots of small businesses across the Three Parishes over the last few years. Helping to develop business plans, identify training needs, networking and much more. His support has seen new small businesses in the area grow, recover after covid, and create some joint initiatives. Also now working on a bespoke enterprise programme in St Martins secondary school, Paul is helping to equip the next generation of entrepreneurs!

Community Events—Pre-covid the 3PBL partnership put on a number of events for the local community. More recently, grant funding has enabled other groups and organisations to put on village events.

Transport —Through the initial car-share and 'wheels2work' schemes, to the grant and loan from 3PBL which enabled the purchase of the Gobowen Station building, 3PBL partnership has sought to increase opportunities to local residents by tackling some of the transport issues. Transport links provide education and

employment opportunities, essential in rural areas

Legacy Projects—The Legacy Art projects have started across the Three Parishes Big Local area, working with school pupils to create something that will be visible to enjoy now and into the future.

Money has also been given to all the Parish Councils to install more benches around the villages, and something of their choice to brighten each village. The schools have also received a final donation.

There are also many grants that have been spent and will leave a lasting impact – improved community buildings and play facilities. Although the project is over, the benefits will continue for years to come

Thank you for all your support over this time, and we hope that you continue to enjoy the benefits that being a Big Local area has had on the villages of Weston Rhyn, Gobowen and St Martins.

Music MOB – saving children's music

A cursory search through local Facebook pages uncovers a huge variety of live music taking place within the area. Throughout the year there are bands, groups and solo artists performing, choirs singing, open mic events, the annual Oswestry Live and now also the Party in the Park. Oswestry's vibrant annual Youth Music Festival which returned after an absence due to Covid, saw a record 1,000 participants. We are so fortunate and we hope the musical life of the area continues.

It is exactly this continuation which local charity Music MOB hopes to protect and develop. The charity was formed in 2019 to ensure that instrumental and vocal teaching remains accessible to everyone regardless of an ability to pay and the service is offered to children in local primary schools from Year 3.

After only starting lessons in October 2021 with 24 children in Holy Trinity Primary School, by the end of the academic year Music MOB teachers were teaching 66 children in three local primary schools violin, cello, flute, clarinet, saxophone, guitar, voice and drums, with the lessons and instrument hire absolutely free.

As for the future, the charity is delighted that almost all the children

who started lessons in October 2021 are keen to continue for another year. This year we moved into brass teaching with trumpet and cornet and also started two choirs and a recorder ensemble. The charity has been contacted by two other schools and will start teaching at Weston Rhyn Primary and Ellesmere Primary in January 2023, taking our total to almost 100 children.



'Spotlight' on Silo Central

'Silo Central' is a familiar phrase to many local residents but others will be unaware of the history and present day work of this Gobowen based charity. Chair of Trustees, Gwyneth Cliffe, explains:

The first funds for a youth group in Gobowen were acquired in 1989. A piece of land was bought, with the intention of building a youth/community centre. There was an old grain silo on the land which was part of Staffordshire Farmers who ran a business from there (next to, and just behind, the present Working Men's Club)

When the land was purchased for £15,000 the grain silo was dismantled and the land cleared, but it had been sold without road access so constructing a building on the land was not possible. The project went into stalemate for a while until we were offered the services of a Shropshire Council employee who had expertise in supporting youth projects at that time. With his support and guidance we went on to achieve so much.

The name Silo stuck because of the old grain silo and although a bit 'quirky' **Silo Central** was officially named as a Charity.

The land was sold without financial loss. We then acquired funds very quickly to purchase 3 and 4 Brook Buildings, a shop and a house that are now the present Dental practice in Gobowen. We received a Lottery Grant of £67,000 which allowed us to start employing a full-time Youth Worker and a part time centre manager. We employed a professional fund raiser who kept our finances flowing for many years in order to keep the centre moving forward.

The building was refurbished to create a kitchen, toilet, 2 large rooms for youth activities, a computer suite of 12 laptops, meeting rooms and an office upstairs. We ran a very successful centre for young people 4 evenings a week and an IT centre/cafe for adult use in the day.

Some committee members volunteered in the evenings along side the paid youth workers and two of us went on a course to learn to drive a Shropshire Youth Council mini bus which was used to take young people on outings. We took young people swimming, to shows in Shrewsbury park & to the cinema. We had weekends away camping and they were taken wild camping, and walked in the Snowdonia National Park. Alton Towers was a favourite, they canoed and kayaked, produced wonderful art work with a local artist and provided the village with three fantastic pantomimes, Cinderella, Snow White and Jack and the Beanstalk.

They had cookery lessons, cooked and ate the food they prepared, learned how to lay tables and the etiquette of sharing meals together.

In those days grants were readily available and we ran a most successful youth

centre that was used by many young people. Sadly, as the recession of 2008 set in funds dried up and we had to close and sell the building.

We supported a youth club in The Pavilion one evening a week called The Green Room and donated to it on a regular basis. We invested the money from the sale and used it to provide grants for youth orientated causes, and also to individual young people in the Parish. We have awarded over £80,000 in grants since 2008.

We are grateful to our Treasurer who took on the mammoth task of overseeing the finances and the yearly report to the Charities Commission (charity number 1021898). It has been quite cathartic writing this and I know it will be to the other Trustees when they read this potted version of our huge achievements, and what we helped provide for the young people of the Parish.

We still have grants available to support the children and young people in the area, including helping individuals with the costs of equipment, education, training or setting up a business. If you would like more information, please email silocentralyouthfund@live.co.uk.
